


The installation will be first on display in Carentan, France, in May, before coming to Southwell Minster from **9-27* September** (please check website for further details).



Church and State

So, we have a new Government, and many new MPs in all the Parties. What a challenging situation they face on many issues. Here I reflect on the centuries-old influence of Christian beliefs and practice on our Parliamentary system and national life, from a very dominant monarch and ruling elite, to to-day's democratic process, with the Monarch as a stable figure-head as Head of State, and a House of Lords based solely on birth, a distant memory.



The process took centuries. Significant developments would include the Magna Carta (the protection of the Law for all people): the Restoration of the Monarchy in 1660: the Abolition of Slavery: the development of the Labour Movement owing more to Methodism than to Marxism: Universal Suffrage: the development of The Welfare State. A lengthy process, it may be far from perfect, but it has been based on the Christian belief in mutual responsibility for people's welfare ("Love your neighbour as yourself").

We need to hope and pray that this progress will be maintained in our increasingly secularised and multi-cultural society, with fewer people acknowledging a Christian belief. (I fully appreciate that you don't have to be religious to have high moral standards, but a Christian Faith certainly guides and sustains them.) Interestingly, in this Parliament more MPs than previously chose to make a secular affirmation rather than swear allegiance on the Bible or other Holy Book.

As society becomes more secular in its beliefs, knowledge of Christian teaching and its application declines. Some would maintain that the downplaying of the desirability of a stable marriage and family life as the basis for children's upbringing is contributing to problems for "fatherless" boys. Our outgoing Prime Minister, a practising Hindu, described Christian communities as part of the national fabric, and praised the Christian values of tolerance, compassion and charity.

Here is a prayer, by a former Archbishop of York, which I use regularly and which you may find helpful.

God of eternal love and power, save our Parliamentary Democracy; protect our High Court of Parliament and all its members from partiality and prejudice; that they may walk the path of kindness, justice and mercy. Give them wisdom, insight and a concern for the common good. Since the weight of their calling is too much to bear in their own strength, send them help from your Holy Place, and be their tower of strength. Amen.

Making Music—together!

Earlier this year my husband asked me if I would like to go to a Prom concert at the Royal Albert Hall. Having never been to any event at the Royal Albert Hall I eagerly accepted his offer.



On 12th August we travelled to London to attend the concert that evening. The programme was Brahams Violin Concerto played by Ann Sophie Mutter and Schubert's 'Great' Ninth Symphony. A wonderful programme, if you have an interest in classical music. More importantly in these troubled times, particularly in the Middle East, the conductor was Daniel Barenboim with his West Eastern Divan Orchestra.

The West- Eastern Divan Orchestra is based in Seville Spain, and consists of musicians from countries across the Spanish world and the Middle east of Egyptian, Iranian, Israeli, Jordanian, Lebanese, Palestinian, Syrian and Hispanic background.

It was jointly founded in 1999 by Argentine-Israeli conductor Daniel Barenboim and Palestinian-American academic Edward Said, who named the Orchestra and workshop after *West-östlicher Divan*, an anthology of poems written by the German polymath Johann Wolfgang von Goethe - a central work for the development of the concept of world culture.

The concert was amazing for a number of reasons. The event was historic because this is most likely the final performance at the BBC Proms by Daniel Barenboim, who is now in his 82nd year.

Ann Sophie Mutter gave an inspiring introduction to her encore; a piece by Bach, which she described as **A Prayer for Peace**. She underlined the power of making music together as a force to unite people. Most powerful was when the concert was over the musicians hugged each other. I'd never seen anything like it before. The stretching out to someone of another faith, culture, country was humbling but made possible through making music together.

The musicians of the orchestra have released a statement

'As we witness and mourn tens of thousands of lives destroyed and communities shattered while political courage remains absent, we, the musicians of the West-Eastern Divan Orchestra, are horrified and deeply saddened by the extreme escalation of violence in the Middle East, which continues to intensify daily. The profound humanistic commitment of Maestro Daniel Barenboim and the late Palestinian intellectual Edward Said stands at the core of our orchestra. In and through our music we seek to model a life of mutual recognition between equals.'

Let us pray that the negotiations to bring about a ceasefire and the release of hostages will be successful and that the communities involved can focus on making peace with the same care and dedication as the musicians of this orchestra when they make music together.

Nottinghamshire

Our county is not rated the loveliest in England, nor the biggest. You will not find the sea or many high hills with dozens of spectacular views here (though there is much to value and enjoy). One of the things we do have is history. There are some famous battles (Battle of Stoke Field in the Civil War); some inventors Godfrey Hounsfield MRI and Nobel Prize winner.; some household names Boots (pharmacy) Raleigh (Bikes), Players (Tobacco), Sports People including Torvill and Dean, Dusty Hare Stuart Broad Chris Cohen and Rebecca Adlington, Robin Hood but he may be as much a character from folklore as historical fact.

I strongly believe that our medium sized county has played an enormous part in the history, religion and culture of England and beyond. Here are just a few examples.

Thomas Cranmer the first Protestant Archbishop of Canterbury lived at Aslockton in the Vale of Belvoir.

The 'Society of Friends – Quakers' began when George Fox was walking through Mansfield, and...seeing St. Peter's Church, felt drawn away from what he described as a 'Steeple House' and so took a step closer to his 'Society of Friends' The villages of Scrooby and Babworth were the home of some of the Pilgrim Fathers. There's the challenging story of William Booth. Booth, took a group of street lads to Parliament Street Methodist Church in Nottingham, but when the door steward, seeing these poorly dressed boys, suggested that they sit out of sight behind the organ, Booth marched them all out again and went off to found the Salvation Army .

What an impact these people, and their Christian religion have made on Britain. Not always for the good, but, in the main we have much to thank faith and religious practice for. Schools, some early medical work, charity work, an ethical basis to life and much more. Back in 1850 there was a national census to see how many folk were at worship on a certain Sunday. The result shocked the churches to the core. What was it? 'Only 50%!. Half of England was at worship – half were not. AND NOW? Certainly not 50%, in fact I very much doubt that it is 5% these days. In my village I would estimate that figure to be hardly 3%.

Well - life culture and practice all change with time. We are busy people with many things to take our time and things to do. But for me and many other people faith and worship are important parts of life, which continue to enrich it in many ways

Whatever you're doing or have done this Summer I hope you have found some enjoyment and good memories in it.

Mary Woolhouse Trust

If you live in North Muskham there is a special educational charity called the Mary Woolhouse Trust which gives grants to students under the age of 25 who are at college or university. Any young person in the same age bracket who have an apprenticeship rather than a college or university place may also be able to apply for a grant to help with books, tools etc. We also give grants to organisations for the education of children & young people.

In your application please can you include, your full Name, address & contact number, date of birth, how long you have lived in the village, which schools you have attended and where you are planning to go to university or college and what course or degree you will be studying and the duration of the course or degree. Students in their second or third year of study also need to reapply each year.

Your application will be acknowledged by email & if your application is successful, monies will be paid out in August/September.



St Michael's and All Angels Saints Day 29th September

St Michael is an archangel, whose name means 'who is like unto God?' He makes various appearances throughout the Bible, from the book of Daniel to the Book of Revelation. In Daniel, he is 'one of the princes' of the heavenly host, and the special guardian of Israel. In Revelation, he is the principal fighter of the heavenly battle against the devil.

From early times, St Michael's cult was strong in the British Isles. Churches at Malmesbury (Wiltshire), Clive (Gloucestershire) and Stanmer (East Sussex) were dedicated to him. The Bede mentions him. St Michael's Mount in Cornwall was believed to commemorate a vision there in the 8th century. By the end of the Middle Ages, St Michael had 686 English churches dedicated to him. This includes the Church of England Church at Averham pictured below.

In art St Michael is often depicted as slaying the dragon, as in the 14th century East Anglican Psalters, or in Epstein's famous sculpture at Coventry cathedral. Or he is found (in medieval art) as weighing souls, as at Chaldon (Surrey), Swalcliffe (Oxon.), Eaton Bishop (Hereford and Worcester), and Martham in Suffolk. St Michael's most famous shrine in western Europe is Mont-Saint-Michel, where a Benedictine abbey was founded in the 10th century.

The 'All Angels' bit of this feast-day was added in 1969 when Gabriel and Raphael were included in with St Michael.



We work directly with the midwives at Kings Mill Hospital, who are the professionals who make the referrals, and are the ones who deliver the gifts. Although our official name is Baby Basics Newark we are seeking support from groups and individuals throughout the area covered by Kings Mill Maternity unit.

As a group we do not come into direct contact with the individual recipients, all contact is by the referring professional.'





The Church remembers angels this month, with the feast day of Michael and All Angels on the 29th. The Bible is full of angels, where they often had a key role in crucial events. It seems that Michael is their leader, an 'archangel'. In stained glass he's often seen with a sword, because in the Book of Revelation he leads the angelic host who fight and defeat Satan and his army.

In the Gospels, angels make numerous appearances. Just two examples: Gabriel was sent to Mary to announce the coming of her baby, Jesus, the Messiah, the Son of God. Another angel was sent to sit in the empty tomb on Easter morning, waiting to tell the startled women that Jesus wasn't there - He had risen (Mark 16:5)!
