Wild Blackberries!



I often share, in my magazine articles ,about my exploits (normally failures) in our kitchen garden. This year has been particularly woeful for me. I did manage to pickle a single gherkin, I almost got three heads of broccoli (until I went away for four days and came back to find the cabbage whites had eaten the lot) and I do still have some rather small, green tomatoes. It's clearly not my forte!

That said, I have been incredibly blessed by some produce this summer. Our damson bush is full, our rhubarb has exploded and the gooseberries have been amazing. We've had rhubarb crumble, gooseberry crumble and (dare I say it as a Methodist Minister?) I now have, stored, rhubarb gin and vodka; gooseberry gin and vodka and damson gin and vodka!

The biggest revelation to me this year, however, has been blackberries! I don't grow blackberries in my garden but you may know I have a dog called Wesley and I walk him daily. My favourite local walk for Wesley and myself is a circular walk around my home town that is almost entirely on footpaths that wind in between the back of houses and are completely off-road. This summer, as I walked, I began to notice the incredible crops of wild blackberries on my route; the yield has been quite amazing! In fact, on several occasions I have repurposed an (unused) doggie bag and stopped en-route to collect them. What a blessing that has been. We've now have wild blackberry crumbles and smoothies and yes, you've guessed it, I have wild blackberry gin and vodka! (I've even got a kilo frozen ready for my wife's favourite Christmas bake, a blackberry tart!)

Having just celebrated harvest festivals in our churches, I wonder what bountiful harvests are out there, in our lives that we may even walk past on a daily basis? What friendships are there in your neighbours and your colleagues that lie un-tapped? What yields of support and care lie un-offered or unaccepted? What doorways and thresholds lie un-explored?

I can't help seeing a parallel between life and my 2024 harvests. Sometimes we work so hard to make things work and can be depressed when our best efforts seem to fail; yet the natural, organic - often wild opportunities that come almost uncultivated are simply ready to harvest.

Maybe we need to discover a kind of re-wilding of our lives simply by trusting that God provides and that there are opportunities out there just waiting to be seized. My prayer is that we can open our eyes and see God at work - then taste and see that he is good!

LESSONS FROM THE PAST -THEIR SHOES



Way back in 1980s I learned a lesson which has stuck.

I was asked to preach to the deaf church on Easter Day. Most dioceses had a special church for profoundly deaf people for it was very difficult for them to join in a 'normal' service. Nottingham had one which met in a house on Forest Road. It used sign language, and was ministered to by a deaf priest. This was well before cochlear implants became possible - the first implant in the UK was not until 1989.

I preached with someone standing beside me translating it into British Sign Language. After the service was over there was a special party in a room nearby to celebrate Easter Day. I walked into the room and immediately felt utterly and completely helpless. The room was silent except for the tinkle of teacups - but the room was full of conversation. There were 30 or more people in the room signing to each other and I could not speak to a single one of them. Eventually someone took pity on me and tried to help me.

And then I realised that the sense of being on the edge, of not fitting in, of being pitied was precisely what totally deaf people feel in a earth of noise. When they walk into a room full of spoken conversation they feel just as I did.

And, of course, what is true of deaf people in a hearing world, is true of so many others....

...a child among adults

...a disabled woman among the non-disabled

...a refugee in a strange land

This is much more than 'empathy' which can be a form of pity - it is more than 'walking in another's moccasins'. It is being able as far as possible, to think like they think, feel what they feel, and understand with their emotions.

And our supreme example is Jesus Christ. He came to be tempted as we are, to be hungry or tired just as we are, to suffer pain and disappointment and betrayal just as we are.

And He is The Way, who leads us on through it all - if we let him.

Mary Woolhouse Trust

If you live in North Muskham there is a special educational charity called the Mary Woolhouse Trust which gives grants to students under the age of 25 who are at college or university. Any young person in the same age bracket who has an apprenticeship rather than a college or university place may also be able to apply for a grant to help with books, tools etc. We also give grants to organisations for the education of children & young people.

In your application please can you include, your full Name, address & contact number, date of birth, how long you have lived in the village, which schools you have attended, where you are planning to go to university or college what course or degree you will be studying and the duration of the course or degree. For those with apprenticeships please advise the name of the employer, how long the training will take and what qualification you will be studying. Students and apprentices in their second or third year of study also need to reapply each year. Your application will be acknowledged by email and if your application is successful, monies will be paid out in August/September. By applying for a grant, you agree for your personal information being held by the Mary Woolhouse Trust for administration purposes only.
